Highlights

DR Congo

MBF helps to support hospitals and clinics that serve the sick and poor in the Democratic Republic of Congo. This provides medicines, equipment, maternity care, income and food generating gardens, and indigenous healthcare training. MBF also provides funding for medical missionaries there.

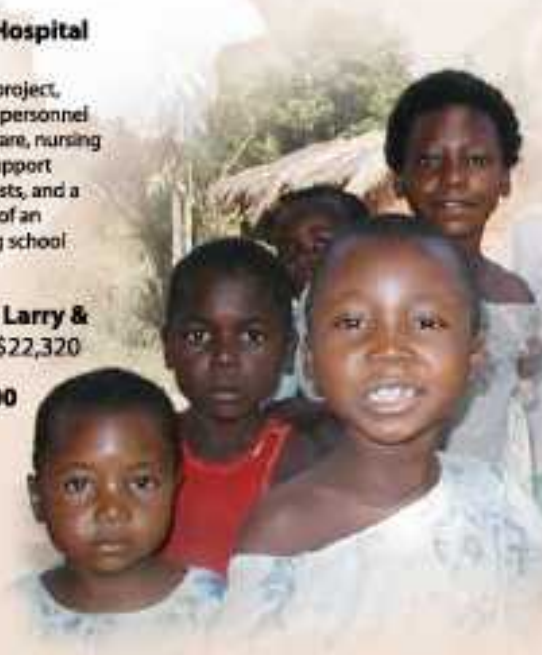
Good Shepherd Hospital (IMCK) \$197,226

Haiti

Even before the earthquake of 2010 devastated Haiti, the people were already in great need and MBF was there. For over 30 years MBF has been helping to make important impacts on the lives of Haitians and is continuing major efforts there. These include maternity, community health, and charity care programs; as well as healthcare training. These existing working relationships enabled MBF to have the best possible response when tragedy struck. Not just an emergency response group, MBF will also be with the people of Haiti into the future, working to make lasting changes in the communities of those in need.

Hôpital Sainte Croix \$4,324,187

Equipment, supplies, medicines, and operational costs. Earthquake fund: building repair, generator fuel, demolition, general relief support, earthquake rapid response supplies, including: surgical equipment, sutures, antibiotics, and other medicines.

FSIL Nursing School \$413,530

Operational costs, scholarships, construction, shipping supplies & equipment, and a grant for construction. Earthquake fund: generator fuel, vehicle, general relief support.

Papaye Farmers Cooperative \$3,350

Operational costs.

Earthquake Medical Response Fund \$143,683

FSIL Nursing School: generator fuel, vehicle, general relief support. HSC: building repair, generator fuel, demolition, general relief support. Misc: volunteer logistics, staff support, phones & computers, City of Champions partnership startup costs.

Malawi

MBF supports many programs, clinics, and institutions in Malawi. Through the services of these institutions, mission workers, and scholarship funds, MBF helps in training nurses, clean water programs, nutrition education, infant crisis care, orphan care, and more.

The hospital continues to grow from its beginnings as a run down one-bed facility thanks in great measure to MBF donors and Sudan's dedicated indigenous health workers.

Where Most Needed
